• The first competitors are returning to Falmouth after setting off at the start of the month. While this event is run by the Royal Cornwall Yacht Club and not us it all helps with the Falmouth profile.

#### Richard Mille Cup

• Again, this was run by RCYC but drew lots of people out on spectator boats and something different for people to see and do and the magnificent yachts. We have not had yachts of this scale since the last Pendennis Cup.

## Falmouth International Sea Shanty Festival 16/17/18<sup>th</sup> June

- This was a huge great success and large numbers across the town, some of the venues involved with the event totally sold out of everything, with others breaking all records.
   As we have mentioned on more than more occasion it very depends on the type of business for events. Hospitality it is no surprise will do well; retail is much more varied.
- The feedback we have received has been extremely positive and the whole atmosphere across the town was brilliant.
- There are so many people to thank on this event and it really is a collective effort. I must highlight Vicky Love in my team who did a great job to ensure the various points were kept on track.
- South West Bars & Events have taken on a lot of the running of the festival for a three year trial with this being year one. This is very much a transition year adapting to the various people involved.
- We have other locations getting in touch wanting to replicate a small part of what is achieved. Many groups and supporters frequently comment that this is their favourite weekend of the year.

## Armed Forces Day/Weekend 23/24/25<sup>th</sup> June (Main day Sat 24<sup>th</sup> June)

While this was a Cornwall Council event, Richard Wilcox and I fed into this substantially.
 Demelza Shankland also was involved from a Comms point of view.

- We had to make sure as much as we could that areas and locations were used as best as they could but also to focus on the logistics with traffic management and everything else. People did use the P&R at both locations and take up was very high throughout the morning.
- There was also massive use of the GWR branch line with large queues at Truro station stretching out of the station itself.
- It is important to reiterate that unlike other events where we oversee them and a
  decision can be made by us, with this we very much fed in to get things
  changed/tweaked.
- The military were very pleased with the event and the turn out.

## Falmouth Week 4<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> August

- Most plans are in place for this such as the evening entertainment, Pink Wig, Carnival, Action Sports Tour.
- As we mentioned before we are not doing an air display this year due to everything else going on and also the Red Arrows on leave anyway.
- There are still the safety plans to update and complete but again these has already been worked on as we have comprehensive annual plans.

## Tall Ships 15/16/17/18<sup>th</sup> August

- The ships are pretty much fixed, as with any event like this they are subject to change due to possible operational reasons.

- There is lots to do with this but the berthing plan for the ships is set.
- We now know the location for the ships in the docks.
- We are planning what goes where on the wharfside and how that sits with ticketing entry.
- There will be a further push with tickets now that Roberta is involved who will do a focused approach in the lead up.

Prince Pavilion update (please note from the next meeting this will be a separate report from Chas but I have included key points from Chas)

- We have now started our marketing phase of the project focusing firstly on increasing
  the coverage of events on our social media pages, as these have the larger return on
  investment. Our next phase of marketing will be to co-ordinate our physical marketing
  collateral (posters, A boards etc)
- The Pavilion is seeing a month on month increase of roughly 60 percent income on food and beverage
- The Pavilion is now entering our busy events and wedding season with our team working hard to deliver multiple events and community groups every day of the week

### **Library Events**

Around 30 people attended two poetry performances in the Library on 25<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> May. The Hall for Cornwall school session mentioned in May's report also went down, with King Charles School participating and more sessions planned.

#### Summer Reading Challenge

The Cornwall Libraries Summer Reading Challenge starts on Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> July, the theme this year being 'Ready, Set, Read!', focussing on books around sport and games. The challenge is open for children aged 4-11, with a separate pre-school challenge for pre-school children under 4. There will be a program of linked activities in the library during the school holidays, and the Gallery will be displaying some of its sport and movement themed automata in the library.

#### Gallery Wellbeing programme

The Gallery's learning and engagement manager is organising a six-week pilot program of creative activities to help support participants' wellbeing. The fee is £15 for the six sessions and all six places have already been booked up. The first session is on Monday 26th June.

#### Armed Forces Day

CS staff and freelancers are providing creative activities on Armed Forces Day in the family area on the Moor, with free craft activities 10am-1pm and 2-4:30pm, along with a storytelling session run by the library 1-2pm.
