LSC381 CORNWALL COUNCIL STREET TRADING APPLICATIONS

Mr Chris Murney trading as Waves: Site 2 Cliff Road, Falmouth

Members duly considered grant of license for Mr Chris Murney trading as Waves who wished to trade near to Site 2, Cliff Road, Falmouth from grant of consent to 31st December 2022 Mondays to Sundays 0800 hours to 2200 hours selling hot and cold drinks, smoothies, shakes, sandwiches, fries, cakes - all plant based.

Pursuant to Minute LSC377 the applicant responded to councillor questions regarding opening hours, plastic free operation, siting including respecting Castle Beach Café curtilage area when they were trading and relinquishment of the consent pitch at Pendennis Point.

It was proposed by Councillor Chin-Quee, seconded by Councillor Eva and

RESOLVED that the Council does not object to the application.

Mr Jason Prime trading as W C Rowe Ltd: Pendennis Point, Falmouth

The Committee considered a street trading application for a W C Rowe's branded electric bicycle with storage box from May to September 2022, Wednesdays to Sundays from 0900 to 1700 hours selling pasties, sausage rolls, slices, bacon bites. It was noted that Site 1 and Site 2 (two traders although Waves would relinquish) were already agreed at Pendennis Point.

The applicant responded to Councillor questions regarding pricing, there would be no tea or coffee sales, and advised stock rotation/capacity.

It was proposed by Councillor Eva, seconded by Councillor Clegg and

RESOLVED that the Council raises no objection to the application.

LSC382 CORNWALL COUNCIL PREMISES LICENCES APPLICATIONS

Pomodoro, 13 Arwenack Street, Falmouth

Members duly considered grant to license for sale on and off sales Monday to Sunday 1200 to 2230 hours with the premises open to the public Monday to Sunday 1200 to 2300 hours.

The Town Clerk reported that the Police Licensing Officer raised no concerns. The applicant responded to councillor questions and advised that off-sales were for takeaway meals only, and no alcohol sales would be made without food service. The café had a maximum of 10 covers.

RESOLVED that the Council raises no objection to the application.

<u>Pizza Express Ltd, Block A, Maritime House, Discovery Quay, Falmouth</u> Members duly considered a minor variation to vary the layout of the premises.

The Town Clerk reported that the Police Licensing Officer raised no concerns. The applicant responded to councillor questions and advised that there were no proposals to amend hours and the design changes created another 8 covers.

It was proposed by Councillor Clegg, seconded by Councillor Chin-Quee and

RESOLVED that the Council raises no objection to the variation to the license.

Lawrance Bakery & Bar, Discovery Quay, Falmouth, Falmouth

Members duly considered a new licence application serving cakes and simple food throughout the day as well as cocktails. Monday to Sunday 08300 to 0000 hours, with the supply of alcohol on and off-sales Monday to Sunday 1100 to 2330 hours.

The applicant responded to councillor questions and advised that the operation would be similar to that of his Truro premises and alcohol sales would be cocktails only, he provided information on menu.

It was proposed by Councillor Eva, seconded by Councillor Chin-Quee and

RESOLVED that the Council raises no objection to the application.
