1. Date of Announcement –26/06/2017
2. Sections 26 and 27 of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014 provide for:
 - **Inspection: Any person interested** may inspect and make copies of the Annual Return and all books, deeds, contract, bills, vouchers and receipts etc. relating to them. For the year ended 31st March 2017 these documents will be available during the period specified in paragraph 4 on reasonable notice on application to the person in paragraph 3 below.
 - **Questions and objections** to the external auditor: Local Government electors and their representatives have rights to:
 1. question the auditor about the accounts: and
 2. object to the accounts or any item in them. Written notice of an objection must be given to the external auditor and a copy sent to the Authority. Objections must concern a matter of which the external auditor could make a public interest report or apply for a declaration that an item of account is unlawful.


