Jacob's Ladder

We all know and cherish our famous Falmouth landmark, a flight of 111 stone steps leading from The Moor on Killigrew Street.

What you might not know is that the name is not a reference to the biblical tale, but in fact a tribute to local businessman Jacob Hamblen who commissioned them. Hamblen was a builder, tallow chandler and property owner who wanted to facilitate access between his business (at the bottom) and some of his property (at the top) and went on to do just that.

Recently the steps haven't been in the best condition and needed some maintenance and decorative work. Cornwall Council are the property owners but were unable to do this, so the Town Council have undertaken some important improvements work.

The Council's in-house work force were able to dedicate the time and resource to make sure the steps are now clean and safe to use – a state befitting of their important heritage status. You will see in this edition of the newsletter that the Council wish to improve and maintain our environment and street scene, and this project is just the start.



Universities

As the University of Exeter's new Science and Engineering Research Support Facility reaches completion at the Penryn Campus and works to create a new reception and shop are well underway, a £4M Sports Centre is now being planned for the benefit of students, staff and local residents.

Subject to the necessary planning consent, this will include a 700sqm four-court sports hall that will be suitable for hire as a multi-use venue: a 350sam avm with up to 90 stations: a 150sam fitness studio and changing rooms, all of which will adhere to Sport England guidance. The building will be highly sustainable and it is hoped that a 50-place nursery will be incorporated into the design, subject to additional funding being agreed.

The new sports hall will be accessible to local groups, subject to the timetabling of student-related activities, and in particular, during the five months of the year when students are off campus. External gym memberships will continue to be offered as they are currently by The Fitness Centre.

Following a design and build tender process, Midas are the preferred contractor. Subject to successful negotiations over the design detail, specification, cost, and planning consent, it is hoped that construction will begin later this Summer for completion by Summer 2016. www.fxplus.ac.uk/build



Operation Chariot

Operation Chariot was the name given to the raid by British forces on St Nazaire's huge, dry dock. It was one of the most daring, courageous episodes of World War II and began with British ships leaving from Falmouth Harbour on 26 March 1942.

The plan was to destroy the Normandie Dock at St Nazaire, the only dock large enough to house and repair the new fleet of large German warships. Such an attack would force these ships

The obsolete HMS Campeltown was disguised to give the men the element of surprise. She had been fitted with explosive charges and relayed German morse code to the enemy, giving the ship enough time to break through the German defences and strike the dock at over 20 knots.

Out of 611 Commandos who entered the Saint-Nazaire harbour, only 27 made it out. Although there were many casualties, the successful raid meant the severely damaged dock remained unusable until 1947. Five Victoria Crosses were awarded to men involved and a fitting memorial now exists on the Prince of Wales Pier in Falmouth. It was unveiled by the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall on 11 July 2008

Falmouth Town Council is making changes to the way we operate and provide environmental services.

We're seeing a fall in the standard of maintenance of environmental sites, so we're working with Cornwall Council and others to take control and manage and maintain these sites better.

We're also working to provide services that others have stopped doing or do less frequently, such as weed spraying and graffiti removal. We want to empower the many fantastic volunteer groups in Falmouth to maintain and care for the streets and green spaces where they live too.

Unfortunately on the night of the election, some people sprayed obscene graffiti in 25 different places across Falmouth. We were out to start washing it away before most people awoke. However the process took most of the day, wasting public funds that could have been put to much better use. If you know who is responsible, please report them to the police.

The first site that the Town Council will take on the management of, is the public open space and pitches at Dracaena Ave. We're working in partnership with the Dracaena Centre and are in the advance stage of taking this on through Cornwall Council's devolution policy.

A Plan For Falmouth

Getting local residents, businesses and groups involved in the new Neighbourhood Plan for Falmouth has been a great success.

The Plan gives local people a real say on how the town should develop up to 2030, and we saw over 100 people attend the drop-in sessions to talk about it in detail. Our website has also had nearly 6,400 hits and we've seen extensive Twitter retweets and mentions.

So far we've had 680 online questionnaire responses and 450 postal questionnaire responses. Unexpected delays with the questionnaire hand-outs have meant that the deadline to respond has been extended to Friday 22 May, so we expect the final figure to be even higher.

So what happens next? The preliminary findings of the survey will be released in early June. The Town Councils Neighbourhood Plan Stakeholder Group will look at the results and set up teams to look more deeply into the key themes.

They'll then come up with specific ideas for the planning of Falmouth into the future.
