FALMOUTH NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Culture, Leisure, Health and Well-Being Background Paper

Introduction

This paper is intended to put forward possible planning objectives and suggestions for land-use policies that will help deliver the Falmouth Cultural Strategy.

The culture, leisure, health and well-being section mainly focusses on the need to address some of the eleven key objectives that resulted from the Neighbourhood Plan community engagement results of 2015. These were to:

- Build a sustainable and balanced community
- Tackling deprivation
- Raising/delivering aspirations
- Ensuring services are adequate for Falmouth and the surrounding area

These may be captured in the single sustainability aim of 'Ensuring a strong, healthy and just society' and action to achieve that aim can be directed through several themes.

Supporting a rich culture is a significant way of ensuring a strong, healthy and just society. Culture can be defined by what we do and how we do it, either individually or collaboratively. Participation in and engagement with cultural activity improves and inspires us, providing meaning to our lives.

Policy Background

The transformative role culture can play in shaping our communities has been recognised by the Department of Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) and set out in *The White Paper for Culture*, published in March 2016.¹

Arts and culture are growing twice as fast as the national economy. They are the incubator of the creative industries (Sir Peter Bazalgette; Chair, Arts Council England)

Their four main overarching priorities are:

- 1. Everyone should enjoy the opportunities culture offers, no matter where they start in life
- 2. The riches of our culture should benefit communities across the country
- 3. The power of culture can increase our international standing
- 4. Cultural investment, resilience and reform

These priorities are echoed in the *White Paper for Culture, edition 2, 2016-2020* published by Cornwall Council in April 2016. ² The Council's stated ambition is to be:

A leading rural region for creativity and culture: where excellence is achieved by keeping in balance community engagement, high value creative industries and cultural distinction.

Cornwall Council's Cultural White Paper sets out five clear goals:

- Goal 1: A place of global renown (being a leading rural region for creativity and culture)
- Goal 2: A place to inspire (achieving excellent community and social engagement)
- Goal 3: A place to create (growing high value creative and cultural industries)
- Goal 4: A place of distinctiveness cultural and sustainability (achieving cultural distinction and greater sustainability in the cultural sector
- Goal 5: A place of growth (Being a leading creative industries cluster)

The Council has prioritised four areas for investment:

- Cultural infrastructure
- Talent development
- Supporting innovation
- Cultural education

Broadly speaking, the Health and Social Care Act 2012 gives responsibility for health protection to the Secretary of State and health improvement to upper tier and unitary local authorities. The Secretary of State will also delegate some health protection function to local authorities.

Local authorities should embed these new public health functions into all their activities, tailoring local solutions to local problems, and using all the levers at their disposal to improve health and reduce inequalities. They will create a 21st century local public health system, based on localism, democratic accountability and evidence.

- Promote emotional health and well-being
- Promote physical Health and well-being
- Ensure good access to public toilets in Falmouth and Penryn

Cultural development and support in Falmouth

In the light of the Devolution Deal by the present government to Cornwall Council and the ensuing 'double devolution' of certain cultural services to Local Authorities, Falmouth Town Council voted in April 2016 to create a cohesive Cultural Service to sustain and develop the rich cultural life that already exists in the town and promote the health and wellbeing of our residents and visitors.

Falmouth Town Council is evolving its own **cultural strategy** in the light of national and regional aspirations and feedback from the local community. The aims are:

• to promote job creation and economic growth;

- build stronger and healthier communities;
- offer hope and aspiration to our children and young people, and
- put Falmouth on the map.

Effective partnerships will be key to this strategy uniting the Town Council with the Universities, the business community, the town's arts organisations and its schools and colleges – all have a role to play in making Falmouth an exceptional place to live, work and play for people of all ages, interests and abilities.

As the list at Appendix A shows, Falmouth rejoices in a wide array of organisations dedicated to enriching our cultural lives and making more engaged, healthier and happier.

Falmouth's cultural past is enshrined in its built environment; its quays, wharves and docks, its heritage parks and gardens, its domestic architecture, stations, churches, shops and street names. The human stories associated with its history and maritime heritage are well conserved and presented in the collections of Pendennis Castle, the National Maritime Museum Cornwall, Royal Cornwall Polytechnic Society (Falmouth History Group) and Falmouth Art Gallery.

These organisations are dedicated to promoting access to this heritage through their exhibitions, websites and learning programmes and these are well used by local schools, students, community groups and general visitors.

Falmouth's cultural future will be enshrined in its heritage, but also in its ability to build on the creative industries budding from the universities, and the opportunities offered new technology

In November 2016, Falmouth Town Council entered a partnership with Cornwall Council to deliver Library services. This addition to cultural services will greatly reinforce our access to the wider community.

Libraries are, let us not forget, a golden thread throughout our lives... The library does more than simply loan books. It underpins every community. It is not just a place for self-improvement, but the supplier of an infrastructure for life and learning, from babies to old age, offering support, help, education, and encouraging a love of reading. Whether you wish to apply for a job, or seek housing benefit, or understand your pension rights or the health solutions available to you, or learn to read, the library can assist³

Open space recreation is dealt with elsewhere in the Neighbourhood Plan by the Environment and Open Space Group but it is important to stress that unlike many neighbourhoods we are bordered by the sea which gives rise to many activities for young people such a surf-life saving which are particularly good for promoting self-confidence but also introduces the idea of volunteering into their lives, enhancing the sense of citizenship.

The Town celebrates its cultural heritage with a vibrant programme of festivals including the Spring Festival, Zestifal, Shanty Festival, Classics Week, Falmouth Week and the Oyster Festival. Many of these 'Festival Falmouth' events showcase the rich culinary heritage of local growers which also plays a significant role in our cultura day to day. Falmouth Town has a regular Tuesday Farmer's Market and is encouraging specialist local food producers to use the Moor to promote their produce.

Falmouth's heritage parks and gardens, Fox Rosehill, Gyllyngdune Gardens, Kimberley Park and Queen Mary Gardens celebrate the pioneering and philanthropic nature of Falmouth's most influential families as well as introducing our young people to exotic flora that is inextricably linked to our maritime heritage.

There are other undercover recreational facilities in Falmouth but most are fee paying. New gym facilities have been opened on the Tremough campus and new 'state of the art' sport facility has recently been granted planning permission at Falmouth School. Many yoga, pilates, dance, theatre, arts organisations and clubs rent space to meet in church halls or other public spaces like the Athenaeum Club annex.

Falmouth currently has six nurseries, five primary schools and one secondary school, a Marine School whose strap-line 'making learning work' chimes with regional ambition. Falmouth University and Exeter University share a campus in Penryn but Falmouth School of Art (a significant and historic part of Falmouth University) is based at Wood Lane.

The Marine College and universities have an important role to play in reinforcing regional goal 3 – A Place to Create.

Falmouth University, ranked at the UK's No.1 for Arts in the Sunday Times 2016 University league table, comprises the following creative departments: School of Architecture, Design & Interiors; Falmouth School of Art; School of Communication Design; Fashion & Textiles Institute; School of Film & Television; Games Academy; Academy of Music and Theatre Arts; Institute of Photography and the School of Writing & Journalism.

With nearly 5,000 students in the Creative Industries (and plans to grow to over 8,000 by 2020) there are over 1,500 students graduating per year into the sector. Falmouth University graduates' employability levels reached 96% in 2015, against a UK average of 91%. Falmouth students are also at least four times more likely to be running their own business, with 25% self-employed after six months against 5.9% across the UK.

The great challenge is to try to encourage creative businesses to Falmouth to take advantage of this rich harvest and to persuade the best and brightest to set up business here in Falmouth. The new 'incubator offices' planned for the second floor of the Town Council's Old Post Office Building could help to support innovation at this scale.

How might the Neighbourhood Plan support Cultural development?

Planning for culture and the arts can bring key benefits:

- **Economic and environmental value** by leading regeneration and providing the support for creative industry development
- Physical and psychological health and well-being by providing opportunities for activity, building social engagement, and supporting the 'sense of place'.
- **Place—making** by providing venues and activity that adds value to the built environment, attract visitors, building vitality and viability.
- **Stronger communities** by building and maintaining social capital, encouraging strong community bonds, active citizenship and participation
- **Support for education, skills and life-long learni**ng through partnerships between providers and the community.

Given the national and regional cultural agendas Falmouth wants to position itself locally in alignment with their aims. The summary of resource that we already have at our disposal justifies our stated vision:

To be a regional centre for excellence and enjoyment of arts, culture and heritage, where residents, visitors and communities can be entertained, develop inspiration, learning and wellbeing

To do this the Town Council is developing several cultural themes for 2016-2020:

These five aspirations provide the basis for objectives for the land use planning-related objectives:

 Supporting the cultural sector in Falmouth and influencing development proposals to ensure that they respect or enhance cultural interests that help to build a sustainable and balanced community.

- Building or improving places and spaces for the delivery of cultural and health and wellbeing
 activities thereby tackling deprivation, raising/delivering expectation and ensuring services
 are adequate for Falmouth and the surrounding area, including a 'cultural hub'
- Supporting creativity, innovation and the creative industries by enabling the provision of space and facilities that help to embed creative industries as an essential and accepted part of Cornwall's economy.
- Developing ways of funding the cultural sector, through planning agreements and community infrastructure levy, and the provision of opportunities for cultural expression through development.
- Introducing measures that support and help develop community arts and the 'festival culture'

To deliver these land use related objectives, policies should be included in the Neighbourhood Plan which:

- Support development, regeneration or starter schemes that include facilities for the arts, creative
 industries, innovation and cultural producers, and ensure that new development provides cultural
 opportunities
- Provide for the development of a cultural hub
- Support opportunities and initiatives for University spin-off facilities for the creative arts
- Support for schemes that refurbish and regenerate existing buildings that support and strengthen the arts and culture of the Town
- Encourage the use of open spaces, in conjunction with the policies set out in Section 7, for performance, pop-up exhibitions, and other creative outdoor activities, and supporting health and wellbeing
- Direct the expenditure of 106 or CIL monies accruing from developments in the Town to help support its cultural services and help build a sustainable and balanced community.
